JOHN BLAIR

A Wyoming native, John Blair is a second-generation saddle maker with more than 40 years of experience. After training with his father, Neal Blair, and master saddler Tony Holmes, he earned national recognition for his exceptional craftsmanship. His work has been exhibited across the U.S. and internationally, including Japan, and has received numerous honors at the Western Design Conference, including Best Artist in Historical Craftsmanship and Best Artist in Leather. In 2020, John represented Wyoming in the White House's Made in America Product Showcase. From custom saddles for celebrities like Slim Pickens to finely tooled leatherwork for collectors and working horsemen, John blends tradition with precision. He lives in Greybull, Wyoming, and is a member of By Western Hands gallery in Cody and the CTA.

CHASE REYNOLDS EWALD

Author Chase Reynolds Ewald has spent her career documenting the lifestyle and landscapes of the American West. Her 20 books include seven collaborations with photographer Audrey Hall, including *Modern West*, *Cabin Style*, and the award-winning *BISON: Portrait of an Icon*. A graduate of Yale and UC Berkeley's Graduate School of Journalism, Chase has been involved with the Western Design Conference since its founding over 30 years ago, as a judge and author of two WDC Sourcebooks and *By Western Hands: Functional Art from the Heart of the West*. She serves as Chair of the Friends of the Bancroft Library and divides her time between Montana and Northern California.

Ren Ferguson discovered his passion for instrument building while constructing a banjo in high school. After founding Ferguson Guitars in California, he joined Gibson's Bozeman factory, where he became one of the world's most respected Master Luthiers. In 2018, Ren and his son Timothy revived Ren Ferguson Co., where they craft custom guitars for clients from their Montana workshop.

A third-generation Montanan, Travis earned his Bachelor of Environmental Design and Master of Architecture from Montana State University, anchoring his work in a profound sense of place. Travis began his tenure with JLF Architects in 2006 and today he's an Owner of the firm. 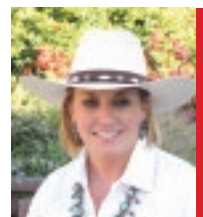


AUDREY HALL

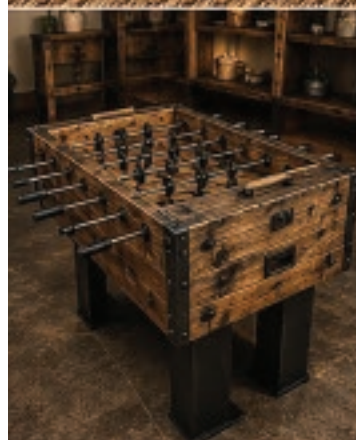

Cowboys & Indians: The Best of the West

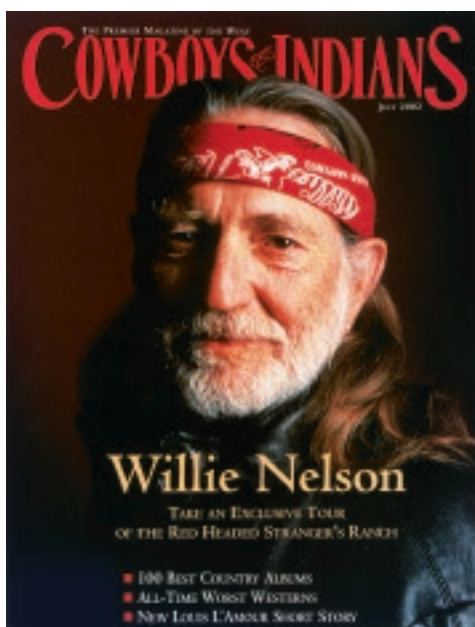
Authentically Preserving and Sharing the Past while Highlighting Premier Picks of the Present

Artful Foundations

From rustic log construction to modern interpretations, JLF Architects has spent almost a half-century creating enduring homes with authentic materials and sensitivity to place.

The Yale School of Architecture is one of the most distinguished and influential programs in the world, with a principle that architecture serves as a way to unite and engage people with environments similarly to that of public art. Although Yale alumnus Jonathan Foote rebelled against New England when he relocated to Montana, he retained the philosophy that architecture is the intersection of people and the environment. Embracing the natural beauty and resources of the region, Foote is credited with inspiring the movement towards incorporating reclaimed lumber into houses, as well as adhering to the principles of building homes to human scale, with simplicity, comfort, and authentic materials paramount in the process.

After forty-seven years, JLF Architects has evolved to become a large multi-disciplinary firm that continues to espouse the mantra that “architecture is a process; not a product.” The use of natural materials incorporated into appropriately scaled and comfortable homes that nestle into the natural setting of the landscape are the hallmarks of a JLF-designed home. Today the thirty-person firm is headquartered in Bozeman, but has projects throughout the country. Although Foote never endeavored to create a large iconic architecture firm, he did intend to be true to himself and his belief that architecture should enhance one’s lifestyle while melding with one’s environment – a principle that the firm has continued to uphold.

Foote passed away in 2026, but the firm has long been under the guidance and leadership of Owner and CEO Ashley Sullivan and co-owners Logan Leachman, Travis Growney, Jake Scott, John Lauman, Ian McGee, and Paul Bertelli, Founder Emeritus. Speaking at the 2026 Western Design Conference, Sullivan notes that “we’re approaching AI in architecture with careful optimism; as long as we retain the human element to ensure that every home is singular, unique, and specific to that client and place.”

JLF has evolved in multiple capacities as the firm has adapted to changing and ensuring high building standards and quality controls. Originally oriented around timber and beam construction, the firm has a portfolio of projects that reflect changing aesthetics including contemporary materials such as glass, steel, and stone, so that spaces feel historically referenced, yet modern.

Additionally and importantly, the practice evolved to become a design-build firm, JLF Design Build, in order to ensure the integrity of the construction.

Over the past fifty years, a lot has changed in architecture, lifestyles, and Montana. Although JLF has grown to incorporate new technologies, materials, and construction methods, it remains a firm rooted with the singular purpose of creating homes integrated to the place, with authenticity and originality, and with materials that are honest and true to the region. It is a mantra of purity that melds sophistication with simplicity. Yale and Jonathan Foote would be proud.



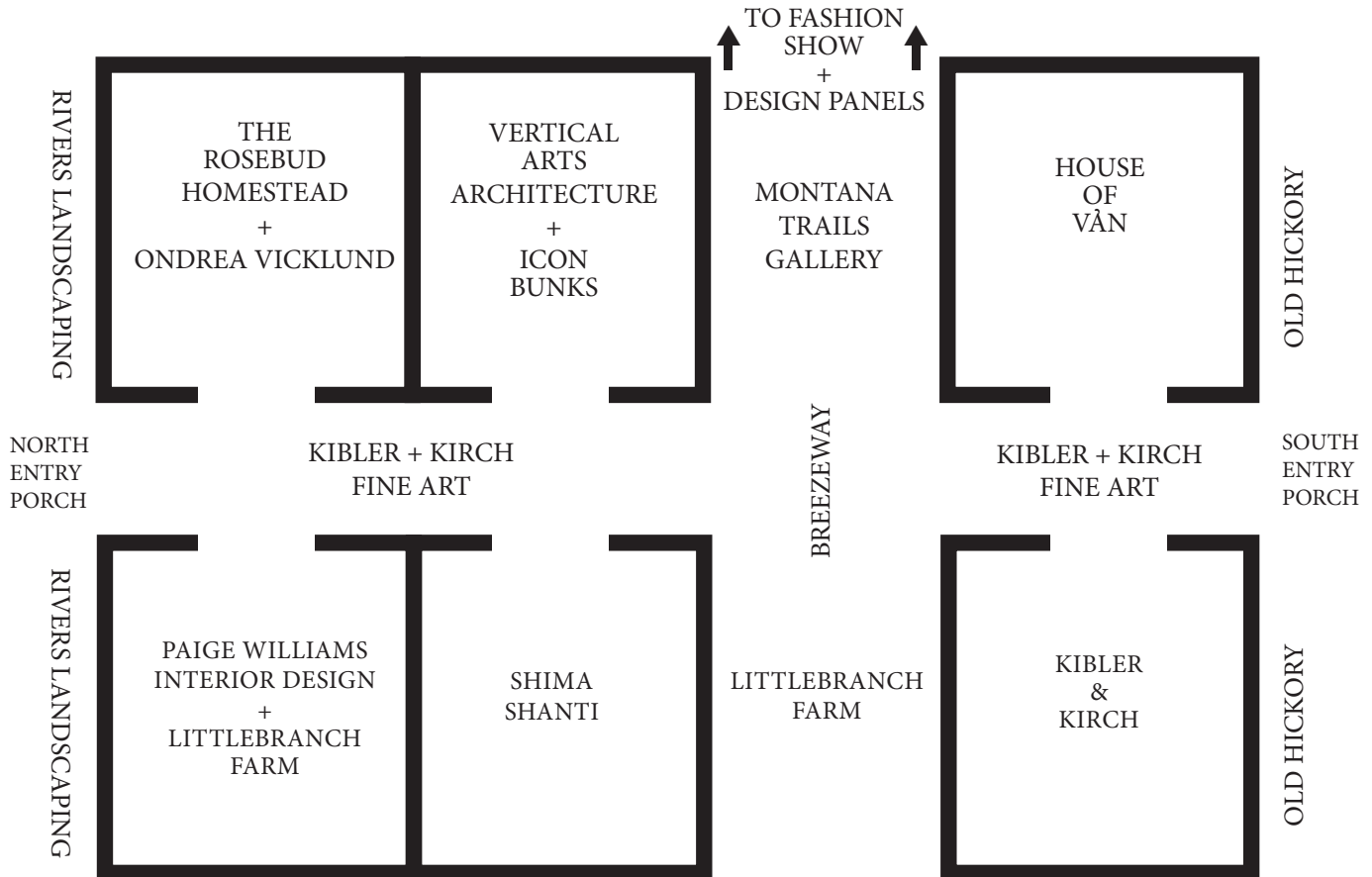

Our intention is not to improve upon it, but to honor it as the icon that it is: a time-honored intersection of poetry and utility," says Young.



VERTICAL ARTS ARCHITECTURE

Bozeman residents and business owners Vertical Arts Architecture and ICON Bunks have partnered to create the room everyone in the West wants: a bunk room. Michelle McCarthy's aesthetic is based on clean lines and natural materials that combine to create calm and inviting interiors in her projects that span throughout the Rockies. ICON Bunks are renowned for crisp lines and uncluttered designs that create a contemporary statement, whether in the traditional twin bunk style or in adaptations featuring beds of differing sizes and orientations. Built from sturdy oak and offering a variety of stain colors, ICON Bunks feature something for everyone while fitting in both rustic and modern homes. "ICON bunks are handcrafted with meticulous craftsmanship, using premium materials, to be enjoyed by generations," says Founder and Owner Jason Clary.

Southern designers are known for infusing color, pattern, and handmade pieces into interiors, and the room designed by the Nashville, Tennessee firms of Paige Williams Interior Design and Littlebranch Farm delivers that inviting warmth and originality. Whether drenched in bold colors or enveloped in a soft palette, rooms by Paige Williams include layers of patterns and textures with a blend of modern and traditional elements. Littlebranch Farm has been creating live edge, burl, and natural wood furniture for twenty-five years, and the store also features hand-hammered copper sinks, rugs, antlers, mantels, and a variety of other home wares.

Ondrea Vicklund and The Rosebud Homestead have partnered to create a room that melds art and design. Artist Ondrea Vicklund is both a

muralist and fine art painter living in California where she paints large scale installations, en plein air, and studio pieces. Artist Danielle Mourning works from her rock house and barn that were once part of the The Rosebud Homestead, founded in 1920 in Montana, where she aspires to create an arts foundation in the original barn by raising money through the sale of reproductions of originals found on the property as well as her own creations.

The House of Vàn by Christophe Van features the intersection of design with landscape photography. He describes his space, entitled “The Quiet West,” as “an art-first interior installation shaped by natural materials, tonal restraint, and a softened interpretation of Western living.” Vàn is a resident of Bozeman where he “bridges art, interiors, and curation through texture and composition.”

Shima Shanti is an Encaustic painter based in the San Diego area of California; however, she cites “growing up in the abundance of water and endless big sky of Montana” as her constant source of inspiration and reference for color composition. Employing painting with beeswax and infusing works with fire, Shanti says that she does not think about what she’s painting; rather, her “connection is to Spirit; an open-eye meditation.”

In addition to the Encampment, Jeremiah Young and the firm of Kibler & Kirch designed a showhouse room, the interior hallway, and the south porch which includes pieces from Old Hickory. Kibler & Kirch is a multi-faceted design firm headquartered in the historic Stapleton Building in Billings, Montana. In addition to interior design services, the firm features a large showroom of inventory and samples and an art gallery. Pulling from all of those resources, Young has created a cohesive whole that represents the aesthetics of the firm.

Rivers Landscaping created the green space on the north porch. Based in Bozeman and working throughout Gallatin County, Rivers Landscaping specializes in sustainable construction and installations of both landscapes and hardscapes.

Finally, Montana Trails, a renowned gallery located on Main Street in historic downtown Bozeman, features pieces in the breezeway. For thirty years, Montana Trails has represented both contemporary artists and collections of historically important and rare works including Western, sporting, and wildlife paintings, and sculpture.

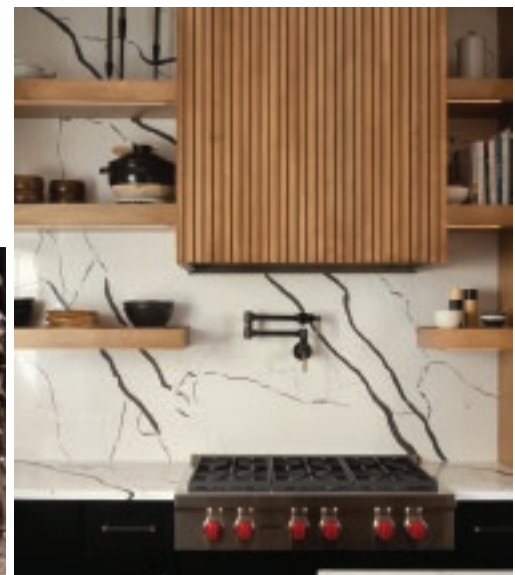

There are many benefits to investing in an older carpet, including sustainability, originality, and durability, and they impart an immediate layer of luxe and warmth to any space. If a new carpet is preferred, District Loom offers over 200 patterns and colors that can be custom created for each client and made by Cade’s contacts in India using wool, mohair, boucle cotton, and silk.

In addition to rugs, District Loom offers a selection of furniture, chandeliers, and accessories. “District Loom is a destination for those seeking a collected home that includes vintage rug pillows, globally-inspired objects, furniture, and lighting,” says Cade.

Cade’s dream of pursuing her passion has permitted Montana residents to pursue their dream of furnishing a space with a one-of-a-kind rug; an opportunity that comes with the inherent richness of textures, patterns, and patina.
